Jesus is the Saving Word who redeems us from sin and death. Jesus is the Living Word of God who comes to us often in people and places we least expect. As the Gospel writer, John, says: He (Jesus) was in the world... and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain and his people did not accept him. But to all who received him. who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God.

On this solemn day, let us rejoice because God comes to us. We join the angels and the shepherds, we stand with Mary and Joseph to worship the baby born for us. He is Jesus, the Saviour of the world. Wishing you and your dear ones a blessed Christmas. Praying that you'll stay happy, healthy and holy throughout the New Year.
