The Mission of God's People

In one of the great tragedies of their history, the Israelites spent fortynine vears in exile in Babylon. Before that. the **Babylonians** invaded Jerusalem, destroying the city and the Temple. Nothing was left and the people were taken away from the land that God had given to them. That led to a huge loss of their identity and led many to question their faith in God. "How could God allow this to happen?" they asked. But the exile would come to an end and in the year 538, they returned to Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple and their society.

The third section of the book of Isaiah relates the experiences of the Israelites as they returned to Jerusalem. Even though the Temple was rebuilt, many other aspects of society did not fall in place. Very quickly, the old class divisions and conflicts between different groups began to reappear. The dream of establishing an ideal society now appeared naïve and the people became more disillusioned. So they resorted to fasting. They hoped that God would have pity on them, show them mercy and restore Jerusalem to its former glory. Here is where the prophet comes in. He condemns their ignorance and reminds them that this is not what God wants of them.

The restoration of Israel will not happen miraculously simply by fasting. What God expects of them is to create a just society. 'Share your bread with the hungry and shelter the homeless poor. Then will your wound be quickly healed over.' Just practicing rituals will not bring about change. God wants us to fast from injustice and division, from the clenched fist and the wicked word. Only when they learn to show compassion to one another, will Israel be restored.

In the Gospel today, Jesus takes up the teaching of the prophet Isaiah. What is the mission of Jesus' disciples and how will accomplish it? Their mission is not to be more observant in rituals. Prayer and piety are a given and expected from each one but that alone is insufficient. The disciples of Jesus are called to be the salt of the earth and light of the world. While salt is used in tiny quantities and a lamp is small relative to the size of the room. they make a huge difference to the food and the surroundings. In the same way, disciples, though few in number, can make a huge difference. The mission of disciples is to bring about conversion in others by the example of their own lives. If they can't do that, then there's no point.

That is the task given to all disciples of Jesus.

Labourers in the Vineyard Retreat


