The Inclusive Language of the **Holy Spirit**

Fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus, the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples who were praying in the upper room. In the form of "tongues of fire" the Spirit rested on them. Then, filled with courage, they left that upper room and went out onto the streets of Jerusalem to proclaim the Good News of Jesus. Locals as well as visitors from various parts of the ancient Near East understood the message of the disciples in their own native language. It amazed them as well as confused them. Some cynics among the crowd accused the disciples of being drunk. Peter had to stand up, raise his voice and declare: Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it only nine o'clock in the morning. (Acts 2:15) Drunks, in fact, babble and speak incoherently. The words of the disciples, however, were clear and direct. ...evervone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved. 2:21) And. evervone (Acts understood it and felt included by this powerful message.

Jesus, the Eternal Word, became flesh and lived among us so that he could be seen and heard and touched in human form. The Holv Spirit descends with the gift of human language that can be heard and understood by everyone, a language that unites peoples and touches every human heart.

What is the language of the Holy Spirit that we can use and be become fluent in? It's peace rather than violence: reconciliation rather than conflict: co-operation rather than competition; forgiveness rather than vengeance; hope rather than despair: unity rather than division: love rather than fear.

Pentecost reverses the Babel experience found in the Book of Genesis - ...the whole earth had one language and the same words. (cf. Gen. 11:1-9). Sadly, they (mis)used this great gift and squandered the power to communicate with each other. They wanted to be like God and equal to God. They started to build a tower to reach heaven so that they could do things without God's help. They wanted to make a name for themselves. It's at this point, at height of ambition and this arrogance, that they were thrown into confusion. They started to babble and were scattered. Today, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, people of many languages can come together as one. to profess one faith and be saved in the name of Jesus, and to build up one church for the Kingdom of God.
