Relationship with God our Father

Do you want a deeper and closer relationship with God our Father? We can really learn how from the Scripture readings for the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus taught His disciples to have a deep relationship with His Heavenly Father through the 'Lord's Prayer'. Jesus also emphasised the virtue of persistence as God will grant us what is good, such as giving 'the Holy Spirit to those who ask him'.

In the 1st Reading from Genesis, Abraham had such an intimate relationship with God that he could persistently plead with God six times not to destroy the sinful town of Sodom if he could find 50, 45, 40, 30, 20 and finally 10 just people. God was mercifully tolerant and listened patiently, the same message conveyed in the Responsorial Psalm!

In the 2nd Reading, St Paul told the Corinthians that their relationship with God started at Baptism: they were 'buried with Christ' and 'raised up with him through your belief in the power of God'. This deep relationship with God is also stated in the Gospel Acclamation: 'to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God.'

Abraham's intercessions for sinful people show the power of praying for others, as God listens and responds according to His will. The Church follows Abraham's example during Prayers of the Faithful when the community prays for God to help us with physical, emotional, mental and spiritual requests for people and the world that we live in.

How does the Lord's Prayer help us to be closer to God? There are two sections to the Lord's Prayer: the 'Thy' glorification of God and the 'Us' petitions. In the first part, we praise God as follows: 'Hallowed be thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven'. Hence, we honour God's divinity, His loving presence in our lives and His will for us.

In the second part, we confidently request Our Father to help us: 'Give us this day our daily bread, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil'. We trust that our loving God knows what is best for us, including our need to forgive others to be more spiritually strengthened to avoid temptation and evil.

I find it more meaningful when I say the 'Lord's Prayer' slowly many times daily - when I wake up, during the day and before I sleep.

Ultimately, a Christ-led deeper relationship with our Heavenly Father would help us improve our relationships with loved ones and others in His earthly kingdom.


