The Lord is Sending You

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells the disciples: 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.' This line has captured our imagination and is commonly used whenever we pray for vocations to the religious life and the priesthood.

However, whenever we pray. the Lord of the harvest to send labourers,' it gives us the impression that God will send other people. That others will do the work. In today's Gospel. Jesus sends seventytwo disciples out on mission. And that's when he tells them. 'the harvest is rich but the labourers are few...' and am sending you. You! He is sendina iust the twelve not apostles. but seventv-two disciples who represent all the baptised. All are being sent on mission. not just a chosen few.

Even a few decades ago, it was believed that mission was the work specialists. Missionary priests and religious would be sent to "mission lands" to preach to those who hadn't vet received the faith. It's taken a long time for most Catholics to understand how they can play a part in the church's mission. Jesus 'I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals.' This seems entirely foolish! But what Jesus is really saying is, I am sending you, as you are. With the gifts that you have and don't have, with your good qualities and what is lacking. Just go as you are.

In the year 586BC, Babylon destroyed the city of Jerusalem and took the people into exile. On their return, the prophet Isaiah spoke to the people. He compares Jerusalem to a mother who will nurse and comfort her child. It is a beautiful image that reminded the people who had suffered for nearly 50 years as refugees, that they were now home and safe again in the arms of God.

The harvest or the "mission land" that we are being sent to is not some exotic country far away. The mission land that Jesus is sending us to is – our workplace, our school, our own home and family. We are sent like Isaiah, to share the compassion of God with the many broken people who are part of our lives. Who need to be reminded that God loves them. We are sent like Paul to our own church community, to heal divisions and bring the community together.

'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.' Today, the Lord has answered your prayer. The Lord is sending you!
