Spiritual Training for Heaven.

We receive different forms of training in life. As toddlers, we were trained to use the potty. As students, we learned about responsibility and teamwork through many activities. At work, we are trained to improve our skills. attitudes and performance. Some people acquire new training when they change careers or retire.

How would spiritual training for Heaven fit into your life? In the Scripture readings for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time, we learn that God invites all nations to 'witness my glory' (1st Reading from Isaiah) but not everyone can enter Heaven except 'by the narrow door' (Gospel from Luke).

This 'narrow door' is to accept training from God! The 2nd Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews mentioned training three times. It is heartening to read that 'The Lord trains the one he loves'. It involves the Lord correcting. reprimanding and punishina Furthermore, 'Suffering is part of your training' and 'punishment is most painful at the time' but 'it bears fruit in peace and goodness'.

Training with its elements of correction, reprimand, suffering, punishment, pain and goodness reminds me of the relationship between a coach and an athlete. In this case, God is our coach to ensure that we act and behave correctly to enter His kingdom.

The training metaphor has also been popularly used. St Paul wrote about an athlete training to win a crown, gaining for himself the eternal prize of Heaven (1 Corinthians 9:24-27). Authors David L. Johnson and Richard A. Hansen had the imagery in their book, 'Training Guide for Heaven: Running for the Prize'.

Your spiritual training to enrich virtues of faith. love, charity and humility could include regular praver. meditation. fasting. service others and daily scripture reading. My favourite scripture reflection websites are Association of Priests. Catholic Daily Reflections. Catholic.sq and wordonfire.org.

You could read books or listen to talks by Fr Donald Calloway, whose conversion story from a sinful life has inspired millions of people. His popular books are 'No turning back: A witness to mercy', 'Champions of the Rosarv'. 'Consecration to St Joseph' and 'Virtues of the Saints: 15 Heavenly Habits for Children'.

You could attend spiritual retreats topics like Conversion Experience and Divine Mercy. Or you could complete Certificate and Diploma courses at the Catholic Institute Theological of Singapore - in English or Mandarin, on campus or online and in Singapore or from overseas. May God guide you in your spiritual training for Heaven.


