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Keep Praying and Keep the Faith

Today's Gospel is the Parable of the Persistent Widow. Unlike the other parables in St. Luke's Gospel, this parable is prefaced with a direct purpose statement: "Jesus told his disciples [the] parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart." Jesus is teaching about persistent prayer. But not a continual nagging or harassment for something. It is about perseverance and keeping the faith in times of adversity and persecution.

In the parable, the widow wanted "justice against her adversary" and kept coming to the judge in that same city. Jesus described the judge as someone "who neither feared God nor respected man". The "unrighteous" judge finally gave her "justice". Not because he decided to review the facts of the widow's case and found the merits in her favour. Rather, out of annoyance – so that she will no longer "bother" him.

Jesus then contrasted this judge against God, the Father in heaven. Jesus promised that God, the Righteous One, will give justice. God will not "delay long over". Rather he will give justice "speedily".

But are our prayers seeking "justice"? Are they not usually a list of petitions? It is very telling that Jesus moved his message from 'praying persistently for justice' to his Second Coming. Jesus mused: "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

So "praying" is more than just asking God to grant us something - even if it is justice. I recall a homily where the priest had explained that Prayer is not about Petitions (Asking for something). Rather, it is about our Relationship with God. When we pray. do we praise and thank our God or are we just listing our 'wants'. When we pray, do we listen to God's voice or are we always iust talking - either asking or complaining. When we pray, do we seek to understand and strive to do God's will or are we just demanding God to grant our will. And when a crisis hits us, and our urgent pravers are not answered, do we then walk away from our faith and our God?

So will Jesus find faith on earth?" Jesus will find faith if we "keep praying and not lose heart". He will find faith if we, as his disciples, remain persistent, steadfast and faithful in our relationship with Jesus. A persistent faith -- secure in the knowledge that our Lord is always with us.

I lift up my eyes to the hills—
from where will my help come?
My help comes from the Lord,
who made heaven and earth.

the Lord is your shade at your right hand.
The sun shall not strike you by day,
