The humble way to God's heart.

How do you win the heart of another person? One view believes that 'the way to a person's heart is through their stomach'. Another perspective is winning through one's character values. such as respect, sincerity, compassion, integrity and humility.

What about the way to winning God's heart? Scripture readings for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time highlight that we can win God's love through humility.

The Gospel from Luke contrasts the selfimportant Pharisee and the contrite tax collector while praying. The Pharisee proudly boasted: "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, uniust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week: I pay tithes on all I get." On the other hand, the tax collector humbly lowered his head, beat his breast and said: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Jesus praised the tax collector for being 'at rights with God' while the Pharisee 'did not'. Jesus also said: "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

In the 1st Reading from the Book of Ecclesiasticus, God listens quickly to a humble person's prayer and responds with love and mercy. In the Second Letter of St Paul to Timothy, the Apostle to the Gentiles humbly wrote that God's 'crown of righteousness' will be given 'not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing'.

The Bible has many examples of humility. Jesus became man to save us. The Virgin Mary said 'Yes' to God's plan for salvation. St Joseph listened to God to protect his Holy Family. Moses relied on God to help him lead His people out of Egypt. Elijah praved for obedience to God's commands. Isaiah willingly served God despite feeling unworthy.

There is also the humility of Saints. St Francis of Assisi embraced poverty to serve the poor and sick. St Therese of Lisieux offered small acts of service to God. St Mother Teresa lived a life of selfless service to the marginalised. St Albert the Great saw knowledge as God's gift.

I am also most inspired by Helen Keller (1880-1968), the blind-death American who became a prolific author and global disability rights advocate. She once humbly said:

"I thank God for my handicaps, for through them, I have found myself, mv work and mv God".

Humility is a true character trait in God's eves. When we humbly acknowledge that everything is from we God. become grateful. people-oriented and pro-active in serving God and others. Lord, let me humbly be in your heart always!
