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## **Healing is His wings**

In the Gospel of St. Mark (5: 24-34), a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years. decided to see Jesus. She had endured much under many physicians and had spent all that she had; and she was no better but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and decided that "If I but touch his clothes. I will be made well." At this time, there was a large crowd pressing on Jesus, as they followed Jesus on his way to cure the daughter of Jarius, a synagogue leader. By Jewish law, the woman was ritually unclean and had to be isolated from the people. But she moved quietly into the crowd. pushed against the many people, finally came up behind him and quickly touched the fringe of Jesus' clothes. Immediately her haemorrhage stopped: and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease.

In today's 1st Reading from the last Prophet of the Old Testament, Prophet Malachi savs: "But for vou who fear my name, the sun of righteousness with healing in its shall rise winas". In Hebrew the word for "wings" (of a bird or cherubim) could also refer to the border or fringe of a garment. As such, the woman may have believed and reached for the fringe of Jesus' garments because she believed he was the promised Messiah the "Sun Righteousness" who was to "rise with healing in [his] wings".

Yes, Jesus is the Messiah - the Saviour of the world. But Jesus does not just save by healing our bodies of physical ailments and diseases. Jesus restores our soul. He gives us his peace and the Joy. In the encounter, Jesus had wanted to know who had touched him. Not to embarrass her but to affirm the faith and perseverance of the woman: "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of vour disease."

As we come to the end of this Liturgical Year, let us recall the difficulties, hardships, afflictions, pain and sorrows of these past months. We could have fallen into despair, lost our hope and given up. But we have not. We continue to persevere and endure. We continue to hope in Jesus. And we continue to keep moving towards Jesus amidst all that is pressing on and against us. And when we touch him and encounter him, may we experience his healing and restoration. May we experience Peace and Joy from the wings of our Messiah!

"By your endurance, you will gain your lives". (Luke 21: 19; final sentence from today's Gospel.)

"If we persevere... we have nothing to fear, even in the sad and ugly events of life, not even in the evil we see around us, because we remain grounded in the good." (Pope Francis)


