Jesus is King of Mercy.

Exactly a year ago on the Solemnity of Christ the King (Year B). I wrote about 'Christ is our True King for life' based on the scripture readings of Daniel (7:13-14). Apocalypse (1:5-8) and John (18:33-37).

As we continue to celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King in this Last Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C), the different scripture readings make me think of another aspect of the kingship of Jesus.

While David was king of the earthly kingdoms of Judah and Israel (1st Reading 2 Samuel 5:1-3), Jesus' kingship was always about mercy. He was full of love, compassion, forgiveness and humanity even when He was crucified (Gospel of Luke 23:35-43).

During the crucifixion, rulers, soldiers and a thief mocked Jesus three times to save himself. If we had been at the crucifixion, would we have defended Jesus-that He came to serve the sick and sinners, not to save himself?

The only person who defended Jesus was the repentant thief (known to many as 'The Good Thief' or St Dismas), who said that Jesus did not deserve the 'same sentence' as He 'has done nothing wrong'. The sorrowful thief admitted that 'we are paying for what we did' and asked Jesus to 'remember me when vou come into your kingdom'.

When Jesus was tortured and tormented. He was truly the King of Mercy when He told the repentant thief: "Indeed, I promise you, today you will be with me in paradise".

The 2nd Reading from St Paul to the Colossians (1:12-20) amplifies the salvation message: "We give thanks to the Father who has made it possible for vou to join the saints and with them to inherit the light". The Reading also stresses that Christ 'made peace by his death on the cross' and 'we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins'.

Before His crucifixion. Jesus showed mercy by forgiving sinners, raising the dead, healing the sick, feeding the hungry and interacting with the ostracised.

What deeds of mercy can you show? Feed the hungry? Give drink to the thirsty? Clothe the naked? Visit the sick? Pray for enemies? Comfort the troubled? Love unconditionally like the father in the parable of the Prodigal Son? Forgive (Matthew 'seventy times seven' 18:21-22)?

As the King of Mercy. Jesus also wants us to be merciful. Note some of His words on mercy: "I demand from you deeds of mercy" (Diary of St Faustina) "I desire mercy, and not sacrifice" (Matthew 9:13) "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy" (Matthew 5:7)
