

### Rejoice and sing for joy

Today is the third Sunday of Advent or Gaudete Sunday. We light up the rose candle of joy at mass and are called to rejoice as we wait in anticipation for our Lord's coming.

The first reading from Isaiah 35 exhorts us to rejoice and sing for joy as our God is coming to save us. Isaiah had proclaimed that "the eyes of the blind shall see, the ears of the deaf unsealed, the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy" and there will be everlasting joy.

What a beautiful vision that heralds the second reading from James which urges us to be patient and not lose heart like a farmer who awaits for his crops to bear fruit after autumn rains and spring. This sense of anticipation fills us with much hope and joy.

And we can see John the Baptist as a farmer who had sown the seeds of repentance to prepare the way of the Lord. This image of John as a farmer is interestina and down-to-earth. something that I did not see in the past. But it is also an image that we may be able to relate better with, instead of him as prophet and messenger. In many ways, we are called to be farmers, to sow seeds of faith in the kingdom of God through our thoughts, words and actions. Most importantly, to sow the seeds of joy in our own hearts.

For us to receive the gift of joy, we would need to farm ceaselessly with courage, patience and not lose heart, asking God to "strengthen our weary hands and steady our trembling knees and faint hearts". We are all meant to receive abundant joy regardless of age, physical condition and disposition.

We have every reason to rejoice and sing for joy as await the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ. It is a time of renewal and growth for us. May the readings of today remind us that we are never left on our own if we allow the Holy Spirit to take control of our "wasteland" and tongues to sing for joy. Happy is the man who does not lose faith.

Indeed joy is not the absence of sorrow but a state of being that continues to sing of the Lord's glory even in challenging times of illness, financial loss, uncertainties and broken relationships.


