Holy Family in our life.

Scripture readings for the feast of The Holy Family help us to 'imitate them in practising the virtues of family life' (extract from Collect).

The 1st Reading from Ecclesiasticus expands on the 4th Commandment, 'Honour your father and your mother'. While the words 'honour' and 'respect' appear several times, some statements intrigue me: "Whoever respects his father is atoning for his sins, he who honours his mother is like someone amassing a fortune"

"Long life comes to him who honours his father, he who sets his mother at ease is showing obedience to the Lord".

There is also useful advice for families living with ageing parents: "Even if his mind should fail, show him sympathy, do not despise him in your health and strength; for kindness to a father shall not be forgotten but will serve as reparation for your sins."

The 2nd Reading from St Paul to the Colossians highlights virtues of a close-knit family life: love, peace, compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness, gratitude and obedience. There is also the need for an empathetic parenting style to nurture well-adjusted children:

"Parents, never drive your children to resentment or you will make them feel frustrated". The Gospel Reading from Matthew focuses on Joseph as the guardian of the Holy Family from the flight into Egypt and the return to Nazareth. Joseph relied solely on God to direct him from the murderous intentions of Herod and his son Archelaus

The Holy Family did not have easy lives and inspire us with their many graces: Faith, sense of purpose, trust in God, commitment to God's will, selflessness, dedication, resilience, responsibility, unity and harmony.

'Saintly families' with several members as Saints also inspire me. The Cappadocian siblings of St Basil the Great, St Gregory of Nyssa and St Macrina the Younger lived with deep spiritual faith. St Louis and St Zelie Martin, parents of St Therese of Lisieux and St Celine Martin, maintained holiness despite hardships. St Monica prayed relentlessly for the conversion of her sinful son, whom we now know as St Augustine of Hippo.

Modelling on the Holy Family (and 'Saintly families') could mould us into a happy family with emotional support, better communication, stronger bonding, shared activities and improved mental health.

Since we are God's chosen people, He wants us to be a loving family in our Christian life. May the virtues of the Holy Family constantly live in your heart, mind and spirit.


