The goal of Ordinary Time is to order our life to Christ's. In Ordinary Time, we learn the teachings of Christ and work to build up the Kingdom of God! The richness of Ordinary Time is found in the opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life.

So Ordinary Time, is anything but monotonous. It is a time of conversion where we grow into who we are called to be by imitating the lived reality of Jesus. For a disciple, *ordinary time* is in fact *extraordinary time*.

Then, what better way is there than to be like St John the Baptist in today's Gospel. He recognised Jesus as Jesus "came towards him" and he bore witness: "And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God". Let us never be so busy or distracted in our everyday ordinary life and its realities that we do not see or recognise Jesus coming towards each of us. Let us bear witness in our everyday ordinary life and its realities that Jesus, the Son of God, is with us and in us: "*Behold, the Lamb of God.*"

Ordinary Time, Extraordinary Time

The Season of Christmas is over, and the New Year Celebrations have ended. My family and I have taken down the Nativity crib, as well as the Christmas tree and decorations. We have packed everything away and moved some of the furniture back to their usual spots. We have also returned to the routine of our work and the chores at home. But this Sunday, after last Sunday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, marks the commencement of the Church's Liturgical period of "Ordinary Time" for 2026 - with the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time.

So, I started to read up about "Ordinary Time". When we think of the word ordinary, we naturally associate it with words such as *typical*, *routine*, or even *mundane*. "Ordinary Time" is called "ordinary" not because it is not special or less significant but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent).
