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The Lord is our light.

Darkness is part of life. It is not just the darkness of night or a place without candles or electricity. It is also about the inner dark phases that some people experience in life, such as personal or relationship crisis.

How do we find spiritual light to clearly see hope or joy instead of despair or sadness?

Scripture readings for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, which is also Word of God Sunday, convey the enlightened message through the Responsorial Psalm: *"The Lord is my light and my help"*.

In the 1st Reading from Isaiah, Israelites saw God's light, after living in the darkness of Midianite oppressors for years, and were thus blessed with greater gladness and increased joy. In the 2nd Reading, St Paul in the First Letter to the Corinthians appealed to the disagreeing and divided community to be united *'for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ'*, rather than to be politically split across factions.

St Matthew's Gospel shed light too: *"The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned."*

The Apostles also saw the light of Christ as He proclaimed the Good News of the eternal kingdom and healed the sick; hence they followed Him to be 'fishers of men'.

God's light also shines through Sacred Scripture, as highlighted in a 2014 book by the Pontifical Biblical Commission, *"The Inspiration and Truth of Sacred Scripture: The Word that Comes from God and Speaks of God for the Salvation of the World"*.

A quote from the book reads:

"The life of the Church is founded on the Word of God. This Word is passed down in Sacred Scripture, namely, in the writings of the Old and New Testaments."

The Word of God clearly lights up our pathway to the Kingdom of Heaven, which is spiritually most precious to us as symbolised in the parables of the Pearl of Great Price, the Hidden Treasure and the Rich Fool. Also, the parable of the Sower illustrates that God's Word is spread to everyone but will only bear fruit in some hearts. The parable of the Good Samaritan emphasises love for everyone. The parable of the Prodigal Son demonstrates God's joy when a sinner repents.

Pope Leo XIV said in January 2026 that praying frequently with the Word of God in Sacred Scripture gives peace to the restless human heart, nourishes the weary, strengthens communities and provides 'hope in darkness'.
