



# Novena Notes

## Raising the Bar

This Sunday's Readings are easy and at the same time, challenging.

In the first Reading from the Wisdom Book of Sirach, the scribe, Ben Sira, offers the following choices:

"God has set before you fire and water, to whichever you choose, stretch forth your hand."

"Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him.

Given these rather stark choices, I am sure everyone will choose: 'water - life - good'.

Now comes the challenging part, it is not enough that we chose and have received the graces and blessings. We must use the graces and blessings. So, how can I be 'water' (i.e. life-giving) to another? How do I choose 'Life' and how can I be 'Good'? Well, Jesus taught his disciples at the Sermon on the Mount just how to do be life-giving, loving and good.

But Jesus 'raised the bar' in the Gospels. Jesus has pushed the Old Testament commandments and laws further. It is not enough to just say that we "obeyed" the 10 commandments because we keep the Sabbath holy by regularly attending Sunday masses, and we have not murdered anyone, committed adultery or stolen something. At the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus extended and expanded the familiar Old Testament teachings. In today's Gospel's passage, we heard:

How we can "kill" with just anger.  
How a person may commit adultery with a woman in his heart by just "looking at her with lust".  
How 'divorce' may cause a person or their spouse to commit adultery.  
Not to swear at all and be very clear in our statements: "Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.'"

In raising the bar, Jesus wants more from each of his disciples. This is most evident when he taught the famous and now, the hallmark of Christianity: 'Love thy Enemies'. Jesus said:

*"If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5: 46-48)*

Yes, we may have chosen wisely and are on the right path to Heaven. But as Christians, we must be different. We must be special. In fact, we are called to be 'perfect'. Really tough! But God continues to give us the graces to be the people that Jesus wants us to be. In our everyday interactions with family, friends and especially with people who are not like us or who are not our friends, do we offer 'water', 'life' and 'goodness'?

Are we with God while we are on this life-journey?



### **LENT 6 WEEKS NOVENA DEVOTION** **JESUS LEADS US TO TRUE CHOICES**


<b>21st Feb</b>	<b>Longing for Wholeness &amp; reliance on God's Word.</b>
